HOMEOWNER SEPTIC TRAINING (HOST) - EVALUATION CLASSES

Whether you are the first-time owner of a home served by onsite septic or would like to become certified to perform inspections for the system serving your primary residence, the Island County HOST program is your one-stop resource for the care, inspection, and maintenance of your onsite septic system.

HOST 101- Informational Only

The HOST Guide is a concise reference for conventional gravity and conventional pressure distribution onsite septic systems. The guide provides homeowners with an understanding of their onsite septic systems and best practices for operation and maintenance. The Washington State Department of Health has provided an INTRODUCTORY VIDEO outlining the basics of onsite septic systems for the homeowner.

HOST 201 - Certification Class

In Island County, homeowners may complete a self-study course in homeowner septic system evaluation and pass a knowledge assessment to become certified to inspect their OSS. Septic system inspections are required every 1–3 years, depending upon the system type. Certification is limited to primary resident owners of gravity and conventional pressure systems and excludes alternative systems and properties adjacent to shorelines and sensitive areas.

Homeowners may obtain certification to inspect their own septic system if they:

- Have a conventional gravity system and inspect it every three years, OR a conventional pressure system and inspect it annually.
- Do not live within the Penn Cove, Maxwelton, or South Holmes Harbor designated sensitive areas. To find your parcel's history, location, and system type. <u>Review your property inspection history here.</u>
- Complete a self-study program with the referenced resources.
- Attend an in-person exam and pass with a 70% or higher score.

- **Step 1:** Read the <u>HOST Guide</u> and complete the <u>Inspection</u> guide (sections of the HOST Guide will be included in the exam).
- **Step 2:** Watch the <u>WA-DOH HOST 201 VIDEO</u> (sections of the HOST Video will be included in the exam).
- **Step 3:** Review the <u>Question Bank</u> (exam questions will be selected from this question bank)
- **Step 4:** Download and complete the <u>Registration Form</u>.
- **Step 5:** Submit payment (\$52) and complete the registration form by mail or at the Public Health Counter in Coupeville prior to the exam.

Exam space is limited to 25 individuals and is first-come, first-served.
